## Shim Hilk

 The number of children receiving skim milk was expanded in all countries following the reduction in the price of U.S. milk to UNICEF in December 1949.
The Administration's proposal for continuing food supplies in Greece, Italy and Tugoslavia in the second half of 1950 provided only for the original number of child food units. This is shown as follows:

## Meat and Fish

5. It has been the practice to make allocations for meat and fish when the Fund had resources which it was advantageous to spend for such supplies. The present diet in Greece includes cod fish contributed from Canada. Italy and Yugoslavia are also interested in receiving such supplies. This matter might be left over for review in the light of any future contributions received which it would be advantageous only to spend wholly or partly for such supplies.
