## **RICHARD JOLLY: BIOGRAPHY**

Dr. Richard Jolly is Special Adviser to the Administrator of the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), and architect of the widely-acclaimed Human Development Report. Before this, Richard Jolly was, for 14 years, Deputy Executive Director in UNICEF, with responsibilities for UNICEF's programmes in over 130 countries of the world, including UNICEF's strategy for support to countries in implementing the goals agreed at the 1989 World Summit for Children. He has also been directly involved in efforts to ensure more attention to the needs of children and women in the making of economic adjustment policies, along the lines set out in the book he co-edited "Adjustment with a Human Face." He has been much concerned with reform and collaboration in the United Nations.

Richard Jolly is a member of the Governing Council of the Society for International Development and was Vice President from 1982-1985. From 1987-1996, he was Chairman of SID's North/South Roundtable. Recent meetings of the North/South Roundtable have led to two reports on Reform and Strengthening of the United Nations (including presentations in ECOSOC) and to reports and meetings on The Economics of Peace, Mass Movements of People (organized as part of the 40th anniversary of UNHCR) and The Challenge of Africa and Southern Africa. Richard Jolly co-edited the book "The Bretton Woods Institutions and the United Nations: challenges for the 21st century," published in 1995.

Before joining UNICEF, Richard Jolly was for nine years Director of the Institute of Development Studies at the University of Sussex. In 1978, on secondment from IDS, he acted as Special Consultant on North-South issues to the Secretary-General of the OECD. From 1978-1981, he was a member and rapporteur of the United Nations' Committee on Development Planning.

Dr. Jolly's career as a development economist has combined planning and operational involvements with research and teaching in a wide range of countries and situations. He graduated in economics from the University of Cambridge in 1956, and subsequently gained his doctorate from Yale University. On the lighter side, he was in 1959 Secretary of the British Alpine Hannibal Expedition, which investigated Hannibal's route across the Alps with the aid of Jumbo, a 1-1/2 ton elephant, and raised funds for World Refugee Year.

Born in 1934, Richard Jolly is married to Dr. Alison Jolly, zoologist and author, presently research fellow in the School of Biology, Princeton University. They have four children.
