I am delighted to have the opportunity to warmly congratulate the United Nations Women's Guild on the occasion of this exhibition. Its founders came together in 1948 to knit woolen garments to help as many children as possible through the first winters of the post-war world -- and the Guild has continued to weave the beautiful fabric of internationalism ever since.

Made up of women connected to the United Nations by work or family, the Guild's membership mirrors that of the UN itself; it constitutes a community of nations writ small, a rainbow of ethnic, religious and cultural diversity.
