Subject: Programme Statistics for June 1965 Board Meeting

This memorandum is to request all Field Offices to prepare certain basic programme statistics in the standard form indicated in the enclosures to this memorandum. These statistics should record the progress achieved as of 31st December 1964 and, we suggest, should be prepared at the same time that you are preparing your year-end report.

The memorandum concerning preparation of semi-annual reports (EXPRO-40 dated 15th January 1963) asked you to submit certain standard programme statistics once a year along with the year-end narrative report. Unfortunately very few offices provided this information at the beginning of 1964. As a consequence, we have no general statistical measure of our programmes since the end of 1962. We ask you therefore to make a special effort to have these forms filled out as of the end of this year.

We recognize the limited value of purely statistical measures of programme progress. Some of the more important programmes can hardly be measured quantitatively. This is particularly true of the permanent services and the more comprehensive activities. Nevertheless, certain quantitative measures are possible for many of our projects and we would like to bring these up-to-date.

Two sets of these forms should be submitted to Headquarters by 15th February 1965. One copy should be sent to the appropriate programme desk and the other to Programme Division, attention Burhan Ilercil.

In revising the enclosed forms we have tried to simplify them and to include only basic information which Field Offices themselves will need. We hope therefore that the preparation of these forms, in conjunction with preparing your year-end report, will serve the needs of Field Offices in reviewing projects as well as Headquarters' requirements.

We are aware that the attached forms are imperfect and need revision to reflect the newer developments in programmes. We plan to revise these forms next year. Your suggestions on their improvement would be welcomed.

If a project has been completed since your last report, give the approximate completion date.

Footnote your figures with an explanatory sentence wherever accomplishment greatly exceeds or falls below the target.

We are not asking you to complete forms on milk distribution because Headquarters can derive the necessary information from reports already submitted to OSU, Programme Division.
