Dr. Charles A. Egger was bern in Baale, Switserland, 15 April 1916 and received his Dr. Inris Utrinaque from the University there.

Dr. Egger was appointed to the Federal Political Department of Switzerland in Berne as Assistant to the Delegate for International Relief Activities from 1943 to 1944. He left to become Deputy Director of DON SUISSE, the Swiss organization for relief to war vistime.

NEW DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR FOR UNICEF'S PROGRAMMES TAKES OFFICE

Dr. Charles Egger of Switzerland Replaces Mrs. Adelaide Sinclair in Key Post

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. October 4, 1967 ---- Dr. Charles Egger of Switzerland took office as Deputy Executive Director for Programmes for the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) today, it was announced by Henry R. Labouisse, UNICEF Executive Director.

As Deputy Executive Director, Dr. Egger becomes the highest-ranking Swiss national in United Nations service. His new duties include administering UNICEF aid to projects affecting the health, education and welfare of millions of children in 120 countries around the world. He succeeds Mrs. Adelaide Sinclair, a Canadian, who retired last week after a twenty-year-career with UNICEF.

Dr. Egger's UNICEF career began in 1948 when he was appointed Chief of postwar emergency operations in Bulgaria. From 1951 to 1961, he served as Director of UNICEF's work in Burope, the Middle East and Africa. For the past six years. Dr. Egger has been Director for UNICEF in South-Central Asia, a region covariant India, Ceylon, Afghanistan, Mongolia and Mepal.

Born in Basle, Switzerland, Dr. Egger was educated at Basle University, from which he holds a Doctor of Law degree. His work in international aid began in 1943 when he was appointed to the Swiss Federal Political Department working in international relief activities. From 1944 to 1948, he served as Deputy Director at Don Suisse, a Swiss war relief organization. Fifty-one years old, Dr. Egger is married to the former Marie-Elisabeth Rohm, They have four children.

Dr. Egger's UNICEF career began in 1948 when he was appointed Chief of post-war emergency operations in Bulgaria. From 1951 to 1961 he served as Director of UNICEF's work in Europe, the Middle East and Africa. For six years thereafter, from 1961 to 1967, Dr. Egger was Director of UNICEF in South-Central Asia, a region covering India, Afghanistan, Mongolia, Nepal and Sri Lanka (then Ceylon).

In October 1967, Dr. Egger assumed the post of Deputy Executive Director, Programmes, at UNICEF Headquarters. As Deputy Executive Director, Dr. Egger became the highest ranking Swiss in the United Nations service. His duties included the review and administering of UNICEF aid to projects affecting the health, nutrition, education and welfare of millions of children in some 120 countries the world over.

In January 1977, Dr. Egger assumed reponsibility for contributing to the formulation of UNICEF's global programme assistance policies, relations with other agencies and governments and consultation with UNICEF Field Representatives through field visits.

Born in Basle, Switzerland, Dr. Egger was educated at Basle University, from which he holds a Doctor of Law degree. His work i international aid began in 1943 when he was appointed to the Swiss Federal Political Department, working in international relief activities.
