2169. Mrs. Roosevelt on UNICEF

Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt was honored recently at a luncheon in New York City by the Women's Division of the American Jewish Congress for her work on behalf of the children of the world. Representatives of the UNICEF Executive Board were invited to sit on the speakers' dais and were introduced individually to an audience of about two thousand people.

Dr. Martha Eliot, who spoke on the unmet needs of children in the United States, gave prominent mention in her introductory remarks to the work of UNICEF.

The main thought of Mrs. Roosevelt's talk was that the needs of children in the United States cannot be met by action solely within the United States. The world is growing very much smaller, and children everywhere are becoming closer neighbors who must learn to understand and take an interest in each other as they grow up. Mrs. Roosevelt stated that the United Nations, through UNICEF, is doing a tremendous job, not only in the aid it is giving but in the impetus it gives toward focussing worldwide attention on the unmet needs of children wherever they exist.

2170. Orientation Course

An orientation course has been inaugurated at Headquarters designed to help the more recently recruited Headquarters staff members (particularly those in the ranks P-2 and below) to gain a wider appreciation of the nature and problems of the UNICEF operation. The programme will consist of ten discussions dealing with the history of UNICEF, programme policy, and the functions of the various divisions at Headquarters. The programme was suggested and planned by the staff-elected Advisory Committee and has been adopted by the Administration.

Also to meet a need at Headquarters for the orientation of new staff members an outline of source material on UNICEF policy, programmes, organization, and finance has been prepared. This has been reproduced in the Reports Office series, Basic Data 1955-11. While primarily geared to Headquarters needs and resources, it may be useful in suggesting something similar to field offices in meeting their orientation problems either for new staff members or for people seriously interested in studying the work of UNICEF.

2171 India DDT Plant
